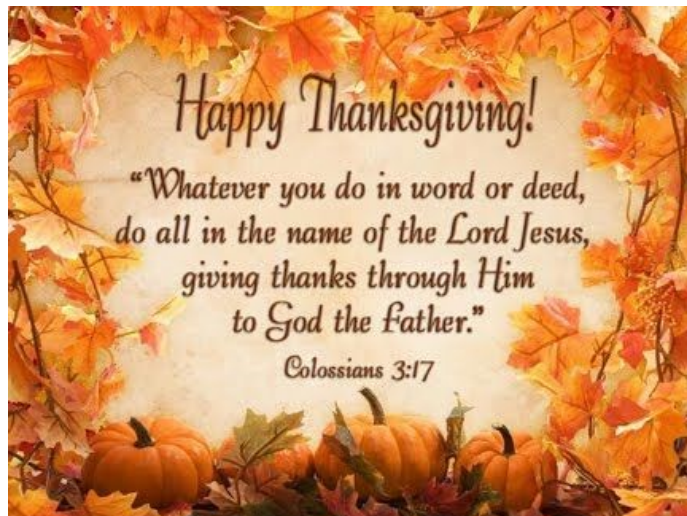

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

On the tombstone of her husband's grave, a southern mountain woman had chiseled in rough and uneven letters this epitaph: "He always appreciated."

As I read this, I couldn't help but wonder what might be written on my gravestone someday. What about you? Tragically, I know I don't deserve such an epitaph. With all I've been given by our gracious and loving God, I still find myself lamenting over what I don't have, instead of giving thanks for and sharing what I do have. I often wonder what it will take before I truly realize that "attitude of gratitude" God created me to live.

Viktor Frankl writes in *Man's Search for Meaning*, "We who lived in concentration camps can remember the men who walked through the huts comforting others, giving away their last piece of bread. They may have been few in number, but they offer sufficient proof that everything can be taken from a man but one thing: the last of human freedoms—to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances, to choose one's own way."

There is an old Hasidic tale about a woman whose name was Anna Kebbitch. Anna was a complainer. All day long she complained:

"I have so little money, my clothes are like rags. My health is so bad that my back feels like the walls of Jericho. Each day I have to walk so far to get to a well to draw water that my feet feel like watermelons. And if that isn't enough, my house is so terribly small that I can barely move in it. And worse, my children—they visit me so seldom that I hardly know them anymore!"

Then, one day Anna Kebbitch woke up with an itch on her nose. All day long her nose itched and itched—it didn't matter how much she scratched it. She tried everything, but nothing relieved the itch. At last, at wits end, she went to town to visit the rabbi.

When the rabbi saw Anna, he asked her, "How are you, Anna?"

Anna replied, "I have so little money, my clothes are like rags. My health is so bad that my back feels like the walls of Jericho. Each day I have to walk so far to get to a well to draw water that my feet feel like watermelons. And if that isn't enough, my house is so terribly small that I can barely move in it. And worse, my children—they visit me so seldom that I hardly know them anymore! And now I have this itch on my nose and it plagues me so. Tell me, Rabbi, what does it mean?"

The rabbi said, "Anna, your itch is the Kebbitch Itch—the complainer's itch. It's meaning is this: However you consider yourself, so you shall be."

The next morning, Anna woke up and her nose was still itching. And, she could barely move. Her back had turned to stone like the walls of Jericho. When she looked about her, she noticed that her house had shrunk until her arms stuck out the windows and her legs hung out the front door. She literally couldn't move in it. Then she saw that at the end of her legs were two huge watermelons, and her clothes had turned to rags. Then, looking through the windows, past her arms, she saw her son and daughter walking by. Anna called to them, but they continued on their way, wagging their heads—for they didn't know her.

And Anna's nose continued to itch, unbearably.

In despair Anna remembered the meaning of the Kebbitch Itch: *However you consider yourself, so shall you be.* And, she began to think: *You know, I do have some money—actually enough to live on and more. What was I thinking? From now on—if I get the chance, I'm going to give from my abundance to those who are not as well off as me. . . .*

And, what was I complaining about? Up until this morning my health has not been so bad. For my age, I've felt quite well! And this home, in reality it has always before been sufficient for me—a single old lady. It really has been quite a nice house, not huge, but comfortable and warm. And my walk each morning to draw water—it's not so bad. In fact I like it. It has kept me quite healthy and I love the smell of all the flowers along the path. And then there are my children . . . Yes, I'd like to see them more, but then I am also so proud of them—for they have worked hard and become independent. They are now able to take care of themselves and will be great partners to others and terrific parents in time. . . .

While Anna was thinking all these things, something wonderful, something miraculous was occurring. Her situation returned to normal—as her outlook on life changed forever.

Now, when the rabbis tell Anna's story, they end with this statement: My your noses itch forever.

Too often in this world, it seems that we have to lose everything before we truly grasp how much we have already been given. My prayer for myself and my family, for you and yours, and all people, is that somehow God's Spirit might find a way to give us a grateful heart, the heart of Thanksgiving, while we still have ample resources to share. And, my prayer is that our "Thanksgiving" not be confined to one day in November, but may spill over into every other day of November and every other month.

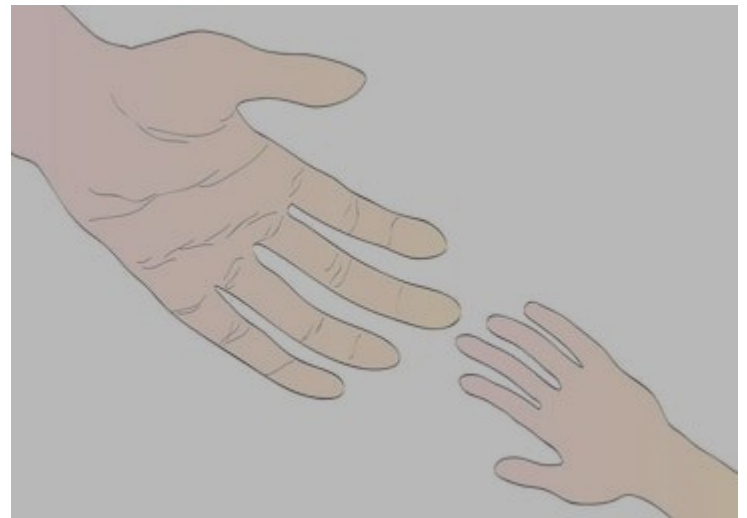
"A farmer," said another, "because they grow the turkeys."

Applying Bible Principles

An oxymoron is the use of two terms which are contradictory in nature. "Jumbo shrimp" is an oxymoron. "Ferocious lamb" is another. "Dumb scholar" is yet another.

One of the saddest and most contradictory is the oxymoron, "Stingy Christian." Because we have been redeemed through our faith in Christ, Christians should be the most generous of all people. We have been abundantly blessed of God, who has given us all things richly to enjoy (Rom. 8:32).

James 1:17 expresses this truth clearly: "Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change."

Think about some of God's good gifts:

God gives the seed (Gen. 1:11).

God gives the rain (Job 5:10).

God gives health (Jer. 30:17).

God gives life (Acts 17:25).

God gives strength (Isa. 40:29).

God gives riches (1 Chron. 29:12).

God gives grace (2 Cor. 12:9).

God gives eternal life (Rom. 6:23).

And God gives us money and the ability to get wealth. Solomon said that money is one of God's gifts to people. The purpose for which he gives us money is stated clearly in Ecclesiastes 5:19 — for our enjoyment.

Some of us make that the primary reason for money. We major in pleasure and the things money can do for us. But there is another major purpose God gives us money, something that also can bring great pleasure: To give it back to him.

That's why of all the oxymorons in existence, "Stingy Christian" is the most contradictory. We who have been given the most from God should be the most generous people in the world.

As the tombstone in an old cemetery read, "What I spent, I had; what I saved, I lost; what I gave, I have."

- smooth river stones
- decorative moss
- 12-inch ribbon
- metal rim marking tags
- Pens

Directions:

Start the Tree of Thanks as a fun Thanksgiving tradition and keep it displayed year-round as a reminder of the many things for which you are thankful.

You can build your own Tree of Thanks by following these steps:

- Find a branch that has fallen off a tree in your yard or church and put it in a quart size mason jar.
- Then secure it by filling the jar with smooth river stones and top the stones off with decorative moss.
- Tie a ribbon around the top of the jar.
- Then set out a bowl of metal rim marking tags and pens.
- As each family member or child thinks of things they were thankful for, write that word on one of the tags and then tie it on to the branch as if it were a leaf.

It's exciting to see the tree branch slowly fill up with "leaves" of thankfulness.
