Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The unknown future can be a scary thing--if we let it be. But, why let it be?



There is a very old mariner's chart, drawn way back in 1525, on display in the British Museum in London. It outlines the North American coastline and adjacent waters. The cartographer, however, made some intriguing notations on areas of the map that represented regions not yet explored. He wrote: "Here be giants," "Here be fiery scorpions," and "Here be dragons." Eventually, the map came into the possession of Sir John Franklin, a British explorer in the early 1800s. Scratching out the fearful inscriptions, he wrote these words across the map: "HERE IS GOD."

The unknown future can be a scary thing. Think of the hours and days we have spent fretting and worrying about what might be:

- We worry about harm coming to our loved ones, serious illness, and death.
- We worry about economic concerns—will we have enough money, do I need to change jobs or my career, or take on yet another job?
- We worry about immigration, liquid borders, corrupt government, amendment rights.
- We worry about pollution, access to clean water, climate change.
- We worry about gun violence, terrorism, and threats of growing war.
- We worry about our children, our parents, our siblings and spouses.
- We worry about those traveling whether by train or plane or automobile—accidents happen, so many because of distraction or drug and alcohol abuse and misuse.
- For many of our younger people who are overwhelmed with the options, they worry about what career to choose, what education is needed, how will I pay for it, and what if I discover I don't like the career path I have chosen?
- For many of older adults the fear of dementia, Alzheimer's, and worry about independence and elder care options consumes them.

And the list goes on, doesn't it?

To make it worse our politicians on both or all sides, so anxious to get or keep a seat at the table, play upon these fears, seeking always to blame the other side for the troubles, and never taking ownership of their own failures and foibles. Rather than rolling up their sleeves and getting down to the hard business of working together to achieve livable compromises (which is the very basis of a constitutional democracy), they do little or nothing but play the blame game, and little or nothing gets done.

If that is not enough, the media on both or all sides, seeking more and more of our attention, feeds the hysteria. And, in a capitalist society, there are always those out there selling us more and more of the supposed solutions to heal ourselves of the anxiety it all provokes—alcohol, drugs (both legal and illegal), more and better insurance, security services of any and all kinds, better cars and boats and phones and computers and luxuries of every and all kinds—all at a price—which only adds to the anxiety.

And we, largely, give in to this rat race of a maze. And, we feel exhausted because of it. And, we buy into the fearful inscriptions of giants and scorpions and dragons in unknown regions of the future.

That is and will be the case, until we, like Sir John Franklin, the British explorer, scratch out the fearful inscriptions, and trusting God, write in, "HERE IS GOD." Here is God leading us into the future.

Of course, the only way to do that is to spend some time, some significant time, with him and his chosen vehicle in this world, his church—not the building, but the people. Food for thought. Take care and God bless!

New Life Lutheran Church Scholarships


Three scholarships are available for NLLC student members.




