Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our loving God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.



John Berstecher writes: "When it was built for an international exposition in the [late 1800's], the structure was called monstrous by the citizens of the city, who demanded it be torn down as soon as the exposition was over. Yet from the moment its architect first conceived it, he took pride in it and loyally defended it from those who wished to destroy it. He knew it was destined for greatness. Today it is one of the architectural wonders of the modern world and stands as the primary landmark of Paris, France. The architect, of course, was Alexandre Gustave Eiffel. His famous tower was built in 1889. In the same way we are struck by Jesus' loyalty to another structure--the church--which he entrusted to an unlikely band of disciples, whom he defended, prayed for, and prepared to spread the gospel. To outsiders they (and we) must seem like incapable blunderers. But Jesus, the architect of the church, knows this structure is destined for greatness . . ."

I've been thinking about this short devotional passage since I found it a few weeks ago. It intrigues me—Jesus, the "architect" of the church, and "the Church" destined for greatness. I wonder, "Is the present structure of the church built according to Jesus' designs? Or, have we, his disciples, consciously or unconsciously, cut some corners along the way? Does the present church look anything like what Jesus had envisioned?" I think these are pretty good questions for us, as a Christian community, to ask.

What do you think? In what ways do we reflect what Jesus, our architect, had envisioned? In what ways do we not? What must we begin to think and do differently to "reform" the church, our ministry, ourselves to become that structure destined for greatness? I'd like to invite you to ponder these questions, as well, . . . and, in time, share your thoughts.

Below are a few selected quotes I happened upon over the last several days that might guide and expand our thoughts:

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and to comfort all who mourn. [Isaiah 61:1-2]

A religion that gives nothing, costs nothing, and suffers nothing, is worth nothing. [Martin Luther]

Once the Devil was walking along with one of his cohorts. They saw a man ahead of them pick up something shiny. "What did he find?" asked the cohort. "A piece of the truth," the Devil replied. "Doesn't it bother you that he found a piece of the truth?" asked the cohort. "No," said the Devil, "I will see to it that he makes a religion out of it." [Klyne Snodgrass]




